- HPCSA & Professional Practice: Our engagement continues with positive momentum. Recent meetings have provided clarity on ethical rules, advertising regulations, and scope of practice updates (speech therapy scope revision expected by October!).
- International Connections IALP: We're proud to announce that Dr. Skye Adams will be South Africa's flag bearer at the opening ceremony of the 33rd World Congress! ➤
- ✓ **Universal Health Coverage (UHC):** We attended the UHAC meeting where strategic policy briefs were presented for reforming the South African health system. Key discussion points included:
 - Workforce & Governance Reforms: National health workforce strategy and removing political interference

- Decentralisation: Autonomous district health authorities and independent public hospital management
- **Financing System Changes:** Social health insurance and universal pooling systems
- Access & Quality: Universal emergency care and private sector pricing controls

The 10-point reform framework aims for equitable, efficient healthcare through decentralized governance and fiscal sustainability.

- Smart Health Africa Summit: Our representative is attending this exclusive summit focused on driving practical healthcare innovation across Africa. Watch this space for updates!
- WHO-FIC & Rehabilitation Standards: We're actively participating in implementing classification standards for health interventions.
