



LANGUAGE LITERACY TOOLKIT!

We are thrilled to have collaborated with Dr. Shelley O'Carroll, who will be presenting the Resource Toolkit during her session at the SASLHA Hybrid Day Seminar on July 27, 2024. Dr. O'Carroll developed the Resource Toolkit in response to the SASLHA Literacy Task Team's Action Plan and recommendations to the Council.

Overview of Dr. O'Carroll's Session:

"In an attempt to solve the reading crisis in South Africa, the Department of Basic Education has focused on improving the teaching of reading in Grades 1 to 3. However, we know that reading and writing has its roots in homes, ECD Centres and Grade R classes where children develop oral language, learn about stories and books, become aware of sounds in words and learn about letters.

There are excellent resources in South Africa that can be used by caregivers, teachers and professionals to support young children's language and emergent literacy. Although some resources are widely accessible, many are not well known or only available within a small network. The SASLHA Literacy Task team felt that it would be a valuable contribution to the sector to create a list of language-literacy resources targeting birth to 7 years. In this presentation she will share the Resource Toolkit and give an overview of the types of resources available to professionals, teachers and caregivers. "





PROFESSIONAL ENGAGEMENT SESSION WITH US DELEGATION

On June 6, 2024, a SASLHA delegation met with a US delegation led by Dolores Battle, Professor Emeritus of Speech-Language Pathology at SUNY Buffalo State and former president of both ASHA and the IALP, along with Dr. Kia Johnson, Director of the Arthur M. Blank Center for Stuttering Education and Research Satellite in Atlanta, and immediate past chair of NBASLH (National Black Association for Speech-Language and Hearing).



On June 11, 2024, the US delegation met with Elizabeth Nadler Nir, chair of SASLHA's Literacy Task Team, and Dr. Shelley O'Carroll, in Cape Town to learn about the Task Team's initiatives. Presentations on the team's work and the Resource Toolkit were shared. The US delegation generously donated books to a local NPO in Cape Town, for which we are very grateful.





Key Focus Areas

- 1. Professional Overview: The interaction provided an opportunity to share an overview of speech therapy and audiology as professions in South Africa. Discussions included the importance of promoting these professions to both scholars and the public, the various sectors of work, and the shortage of available positions for qualified professionals.
- 2. Service Provision Challenges: The session highlighted challenges in service provision, emphasising the critical distinction between 'disorder' and 'difference' and its impact on assessments for children from diverse linguistic and cultural backgrounds. The SASLHA delegation acknowledged that many therapists feel unprepared to work with South Africa's vast cultural and linguistic diversity. The US delegation introduced the KASA framework (Knowledge, Awareness, Skills, and Attitude) for professional development, underscoring the importance of culturally responsive education. They stressed recognising cultural and linguistic diversity, including bilingualism and multilingualism, and discussed the need for advocacy for the professions and clients to influence relevant stakeholders.
- 3. A SASLHA representative was invited to join ASHA as an International Affiliate offering access to a wide range of benefits for the association. NBASLH extended an invitation to SASLHA to join them at a future Congress.

STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENT FEEDBACK

- Stakeholder Engagement Plan: We have been diligently updating our Stakeholder Engagement Plan to highlight each committee's priority stakeholders, goals, and corresponding action plans.
- HPCSA SLH Board: The SASLHA Council continues to engage with the HPCSA SLH Board, advocating for SASLHA's support in developing guidelines for the use of NMES in dysphagia treatment.
- The 18th meeting of the Interprofessional Rehabilitation Indaba (IPRI) was held on 6 June 2024.
 Key action points include:
 - The IPRI will develop a comprehensive rehabilitation plan to present to the NDoH and prepare a grant proposal for funding and research.
 - Representatives will share potential solutions to problems identified during Community Service placements at the ICSP workshop on June 7, 2024.
 - iPRI members have attended numerous provincial NHI meetings in KZN, Mahikeng, Gauteng, Northern Cape and Mpumalanga to advocate for the inclusion and provision of rehabilitation practitioners. They emphasised the importance of maintaining a strong profile and regularly reminding others of their presence. Despite challenges, the team has made significant efforts to engage with facilitators
 - NDoH
 - Representatives from the Interprofessional Rehabilitation Indaba (IPRI), met with **Dr. Luvuyo and Dr. Ravhengani from the NDoH HRH Cluster** on 12 June 2024. Key items added to the action plan include:
 - Dr. Bayeni will organise a PHC HRH symposium to discuss the HRH platform in primary healthcare settings, including the value of midlevel workers.
 - Dr. Bayeni will discuss a mentorship program for community service interns with the ICSP team and explore integrating it into the ICSP platform.
 - The IPRI will prepare a proposal for an extended training platform for students and plan for a future meeting to discuss it.
